

How Do I Become a PSC First Responder Chaplain?

Benefits of Membership

- 1. Connection to faith-based Chaplains from many different regions. Facilitation of relationship and referral information including areas outside of where you serve.
- Planned events create opportunity for continued relational growth. Included are quarterly luncheons, regional gatherings, Chaplain trainings, and Annual Advanced Academies.
- 3. There is no membership fee. Chaplains may request reimbursement for trainings or Chaplain wellness resources (including counseling sessions, books, or other which may be covered when pre-approved by the Executive Director.)
- 4. Consultation and prayer are readily available with the Executive Director and/or the Director of Chaplain Wellness.
- 5. Encouragement, mentorship, and resources help develop Chaplain confidence, competence, finances, and most importantly one's walk with the Lord.
- 6. Community assistance funds provide resources for on-call community need.
- 7. A PSC Chaplain shirt is provided.
- 8. Chaplain donations may be made to the 501c3 for a low 5% Admin fee.
- 9. Liability insurance coverage is provided for PSC Chaplain activities.
- 10. You are not alone in your service as a First Responder Chaplain.

Steps for Full PSC Chaplain Membership

- 1. Intro meeting with Executive Director.
- 2. Complete the PSC application and sign the Statement of Faith.
- 3. Attach a resume/CV that includes a work history.
- 4. Submit an ecclesiastical endorsement using the letter template provided.
- 5. Interview with the PSC interviewing team.
- 6. Upon approval, acceptance is conditional upon a background check.
- 7. Complete PSC paperwork and submit picture for website as Chaplain in Training.
- 8. Successfully complete the Oregon Chaplains Basics Academy.
- 9. Complete two CISM (Critical Incident Stress Management) courses including. Assisting Individuals in Crisis and Group Crisis intervention.
- 10. Participate in PSC Chaplain Connects, agency, and regional cohort meetings.
- 11. Document 60 hours of mentored First Responder Chaplain experience (including shadowing an existing chaplain) as confirmed by signed documentation.
- 12. PSC Executive Team check-in with mentor and agency endorsement.
- 13. Advancement to full PSC Chaplain.
